



Mayor's Minute

Happy Founders Day friends! The evening of Friday, June 20th kicks off the city's Linger at the Lake Concert Series in partnership with Re*Imagine Founders Day activities and Fireworks Show. Saturday, June 21st, Founders Day will open at 9:45am with a ceremonial ribbon cutting in celebration of the finished Lefevre Street Beautification Project followed by the traditional Founders Day Parade. See you there!

Stay engaged and informed! A Fireworks **Advisory** Vote was approved by Medical Lake City Council and will appear on your November 2025 ballot. This vote is non-binding, meaning the outcome will not change the current fireworks law, but will serve to advise the council about how Medical Lake citizens feel regarding the personal use of fireworks in city limits. Any action,

or non-action, will then be up to your city council. For decades now, every summer, citizens both for and against the personal use of fireworks have attended council meetings to share their concerns, and many have called for a vote saying, ask the people. I agree! I agree it is time to hear the voice of the people on this issue, and that is why I asked the City Council to approve this ballot measure, which they have. What can you do? First, **REGISTER** to Vote. Secondly, sign up at city hall to **SERVE** on one of the required FOR or AGAINST Committees. City Council Corner

A November Fireworks Advisory Vote Ballot Measure will ask citizens whether the sale, possession, and discharge of consumer fireworks should be prohibited in the City of Medical Lake. "For" and "Against" committees of not more than 3 members each will be appointed to prepare and submit statements for the voter's pamphlet. If you are interested in serving on either committee, please send a letter of interest to city@medical-lake.org, or drop it off at City Hall by 4:00 pm on 6/30/2025.

A Post Legislative Session Report was provided by the City's government affairs consultant, highlighting the governmentto-government transfer of Waterfront Park from DSHS to the City of Medical Lake, increased funding for police services at Eastern State Hospital, and increased awareness of fire recovery needs. Our 6th District legislators delivered.

City Financial Updates included a 2025 Fee Schedule Amendment to streamline and simplify reservation and use of park spaces, and City Council approved the 2024 Annual Report and a budget amendment accounting for the purchase of the Historic Medical Lake Train Depot and delayed 2024 law enforcement invoices, 2025 Spokane County Jail settle and adjust costs, and increased animal control costs.

Lefevre St. Complete Streets Project Ribbon Cutting is set to take place prior to the Founders Day parade on 6/21. The curbs, sidewalks, trees, pedestrian lamps, and flower baskets will all be in place and you are invited to join us in celebrating project completion!
