




## **Mayor's Minute**

Fireworks Advisory Vote Ballot Measure. City Council is asking voters to advise them on whether or not to prohibit the sale, possession, and discharge of consumer fireworks in Medical Lake. On November's Ballot, voters can voice their opinion, and the outcome may then be used by City Council to either take action to prohibit fireworks or leave things as they currently are. The Mayor appointed community members to "For" and "Against" Committees, whose statements will be in the Voter's Pamphlet along with an explanatory statement on the ballot measure. Thanks to grant funding from the Office of the Secretary of State, we replaced all outdated shelving with sturdy metal units, re-boxed records into uniform State Archive boxes, and removed all non-record items to ensure a clean, efficient, and compliant storage space. A special thank you to project staff Kylie Wright and Sabrina Peterson for their exceptional work and dedication. This project was completed ahead of schedule and sets the foundation for a more consistent and accessible records management system.

Waterfront Park Ballfield Lights. A majority of the wooden poles supporting softball field lights in Waterfront Park were destroyed during the Gray Road Fire. The City submitted and received payment from Washington Cities Insurance Authority for a related claim. City Council awarded the work to Triumph Electric, who is hard at work installing the new metal poles and LED lights. A
