



Mayor's Minute

It is with a heavy heart I write this Mayor's Minute. I wish to express my heartfelt prayers and condolences to the family, friends, and staff at Eastern State Hospital who knew and loved Colleen Hendrickson-Bass. Colleen died in line of duty in the early morning hour of September 27, 2025, as she stood guard at Eastern State Hospital. I also wish to express comfort and prayers for the family terrorized by the home invasion; all of this was an unexpected and appalling attack on our community. We are grateful for our well-trained and professional first responders at the Spokane County Sheriff's Office, Fire District #3, and other mutual aid agencies who responded quickly and professionally to mitigate the attack.

I have had many questions about the improvements seen on Lefevre and Lake Streets. I hope you're enjoying them. All public works projects were paid for with grants and awards specific to the

projects. Please note the City of Medical Lake did not receive any of the WA State Emergency Management fire funding, those awards went to Spokane County.

Gray Fire Financial Report Prepared by Koss Ronholt, Finance Director <u>Department of Commerce:</u> \$182,000

-Partial reimbursement for \$190,413.80 in expenditures, including hazardous tree removal, hazardous stump grinding, water meters destroyed in fire, barricades and signage rental, water used in firefighting efforts, write-off of utility bills for fire victims, generator rental, and labor costs directly related to fire response and recovery efforts.

Spokane County: \$17,000

-Full reimbursement for \$17,000 for tree grinding.

Insurance: \$440,294.21

-Full reimbursement for \$445,294.21 (less \$5,000 deductible) for structure debris removal at Waterfront Park, destroyed recreation and park maintenance equipment, destroyed park benches, destroyed fences, damage repair on Maintenance building, and destroyed ballfield lights.

<u>FEMA</u>: City has incurred \$788,911.95 in FEMA qualifying damages, which are reimbursed at 75% of cost (federal portion) and 12.5% of cost (state portion). Of this amount, the City will pay approximately \$148,627.71 out of pocket, but we are still pursuing the state to help make us whole.

The City used its Contingency Fund to pay for expenditures related to the Gray Road Fire and the City Council established the Emergency Response Fund in 2024 to receive any future reimbursements and better prepare the City for any future disasters. All reimbursements for such expenditures have been deposited into the Emergency Response Fund and may not be used for anything other than a declared emergency. The Emergency Response Fund's current balance is \$253,772.55.

The Contingency Fund did not have enough funds to cover all fire related expenditures incurred, so \$171,000 was transferred from the General Fund to support it. Because reimbursed expenditures were deposited into the Emergency Response Fund, this means \$171,000 of City funds have been set aside for potential future emergencies.

Regular operations of city business continue as we wrap up summer projects and prepare for Winter. Don't forget to mark your calendar for Re*Imagine Fall Festival, Saturday, October 25, 2025, 1pm-4pm, at the High School Bus Loop.

Video Surveillance Cameras Approved. City Council authorized the use of surveillance cameras to deter theft and vandalism on City owned or managed property at Waterfront Park, Pioneer Park, Coney Island Park, and Shepard Field. STA Route 62 Changes and Capital Improvements. Our partners at the Spokane Transit Authority presented on changes to Route 62 through town (F SPO Lft Route062 w3h2 Z250808.pdf) as well as \$200,000 worth of improvements that will take place at 8 local bus stops. 2026 City Budget Hearings Scheduled. Budget season is upon us, and the City's 2026 budget planning is underway. City



Council is scheduled to have a Budget Retreat on 10/15 from 10am until 2pm at Silver Lake Bible Camp to review the 2026 Capital Improvement Plan Update, 2026 salaries and benefits, revenue projections, and a preliminary budget overview. A Revenue Sources and Property Tax Hearing is scheduled for 10/21 and will result in a required Property Tax Ordinance. A preliminary budget hearing is set for 11/18, and the final budget hearing will occur during the 12/2 City Council meeting. Citizens are welcome to share ideas and comments in writing or in person during the hearings.
